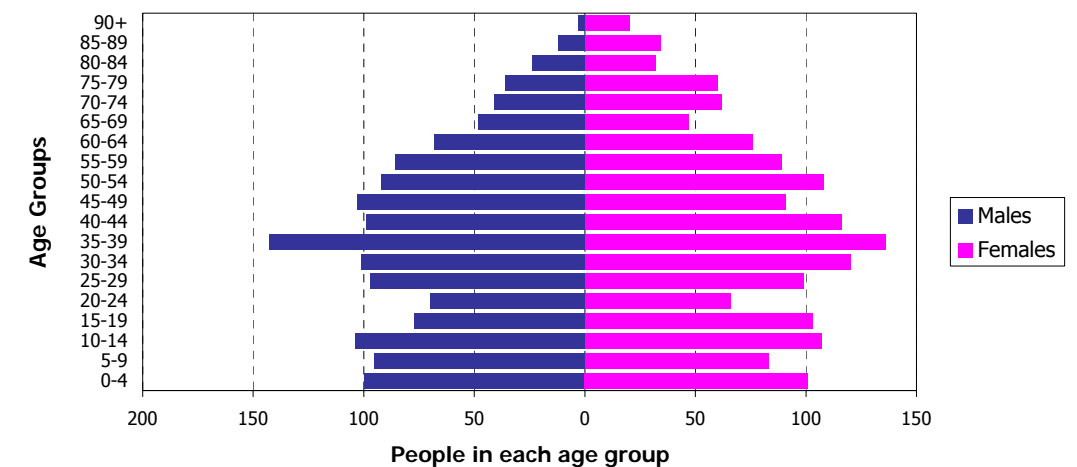

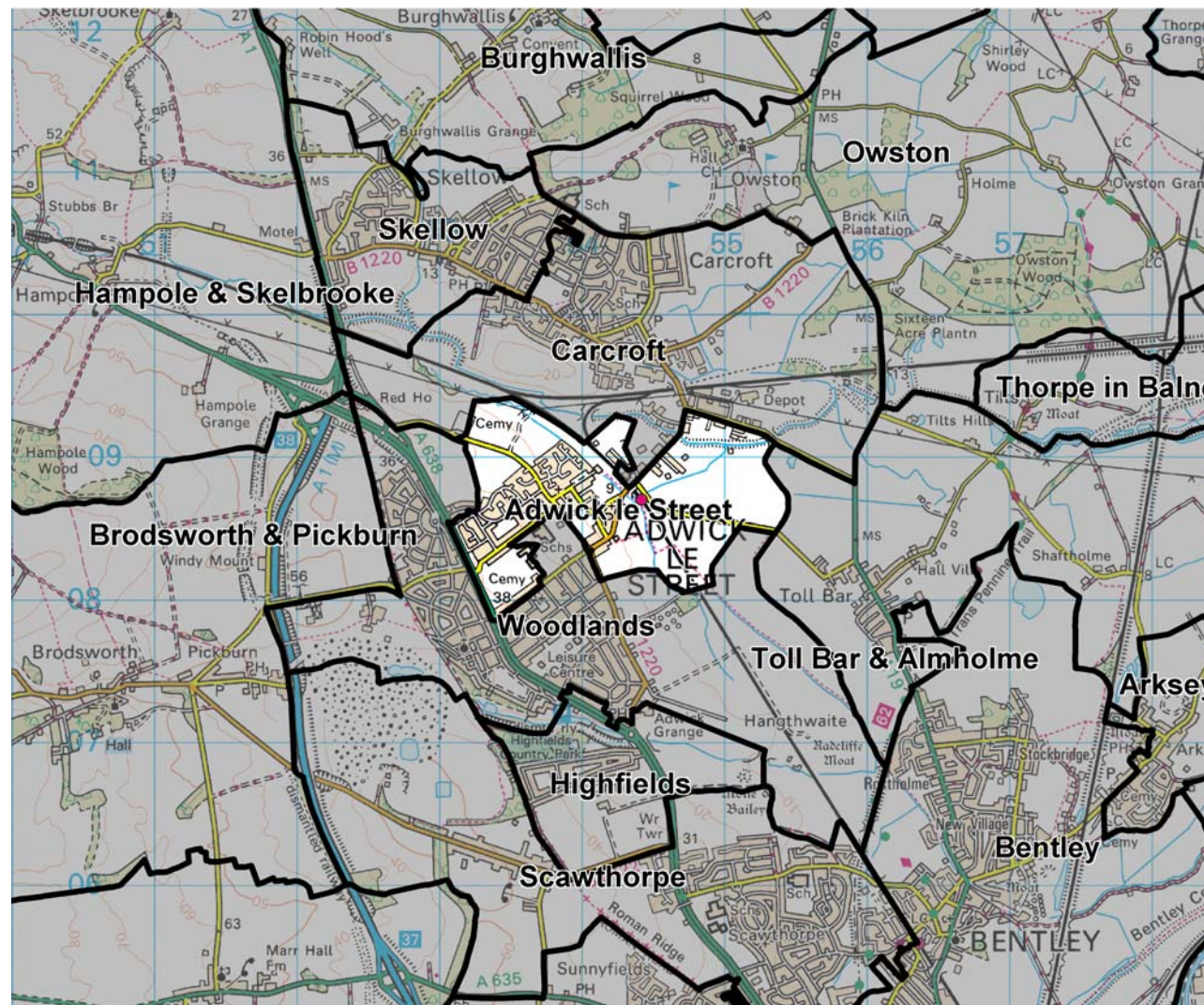

 - 44 males (3.1% of the population) and 75 females (4.8%) have diabetes
