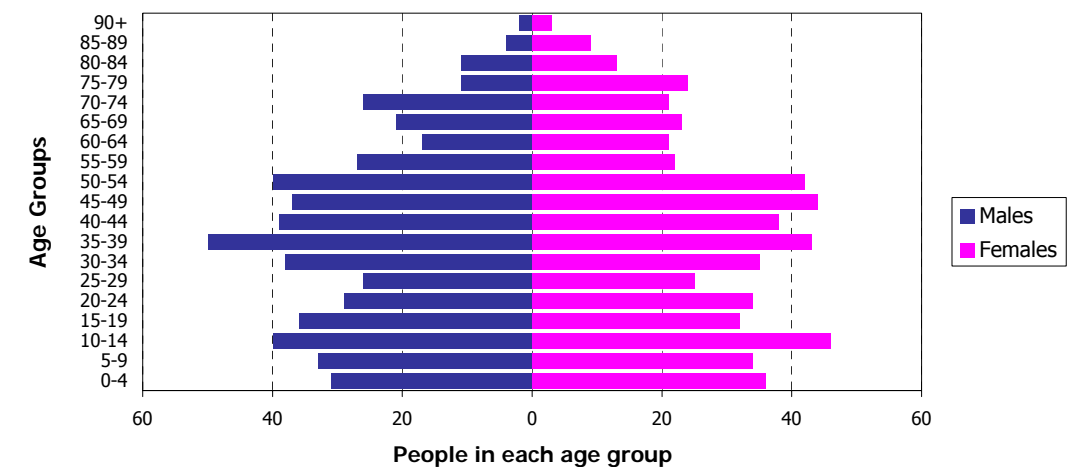

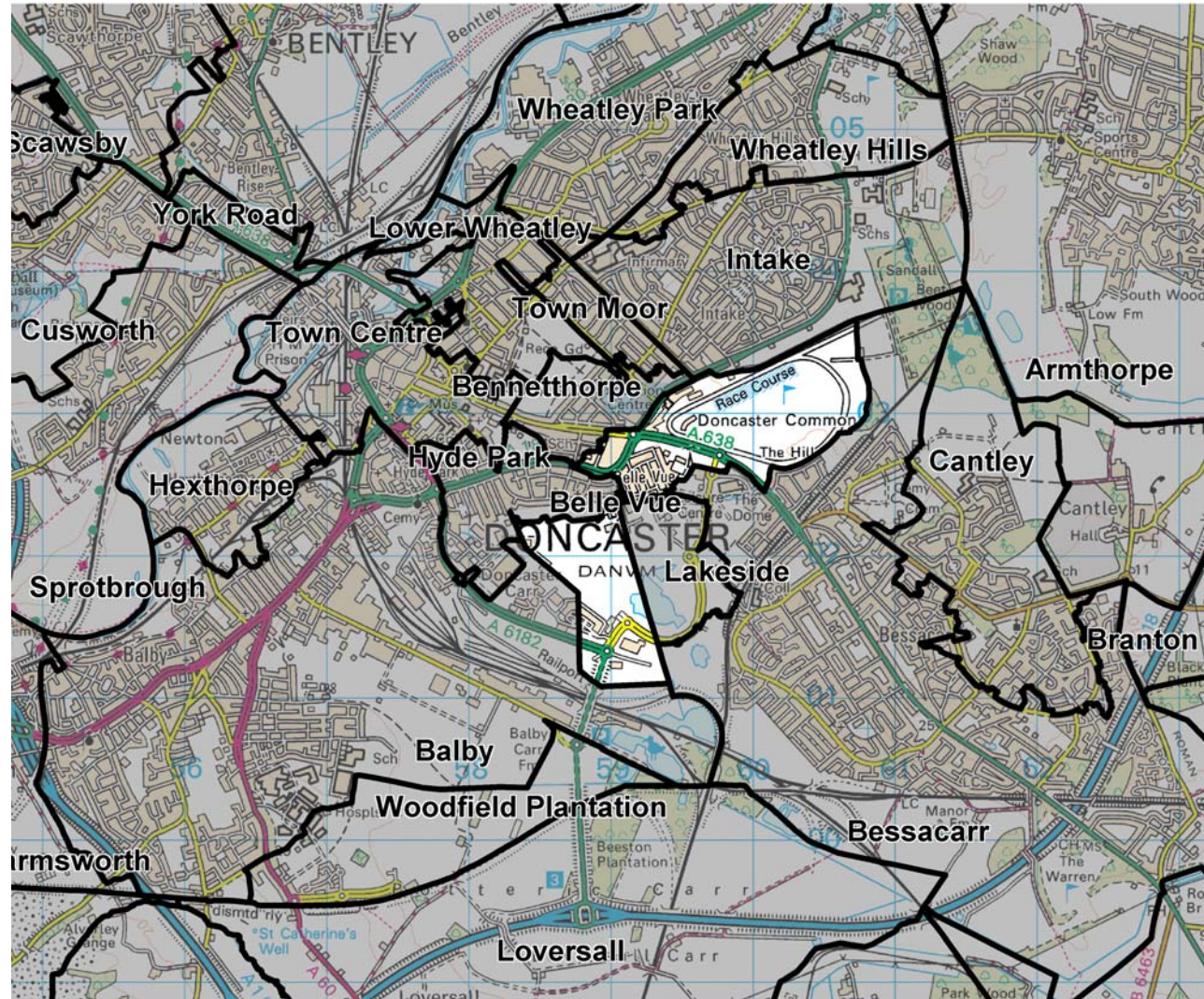

Modelled Prevalence Data

- Using national survey data, we can predict that, in Belle Vue:
- 184 adults (22.3% of the 16+ population) and 14 children (6.8%) are obese
 - 47 adults (5.7% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
 - 18 males (3.5% of the population) and 27 females (4.9%) have diabetes
