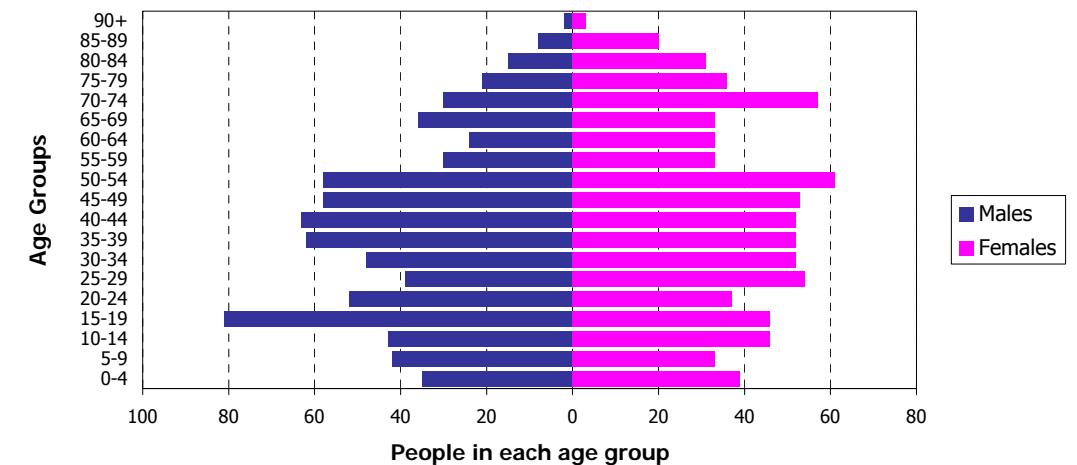

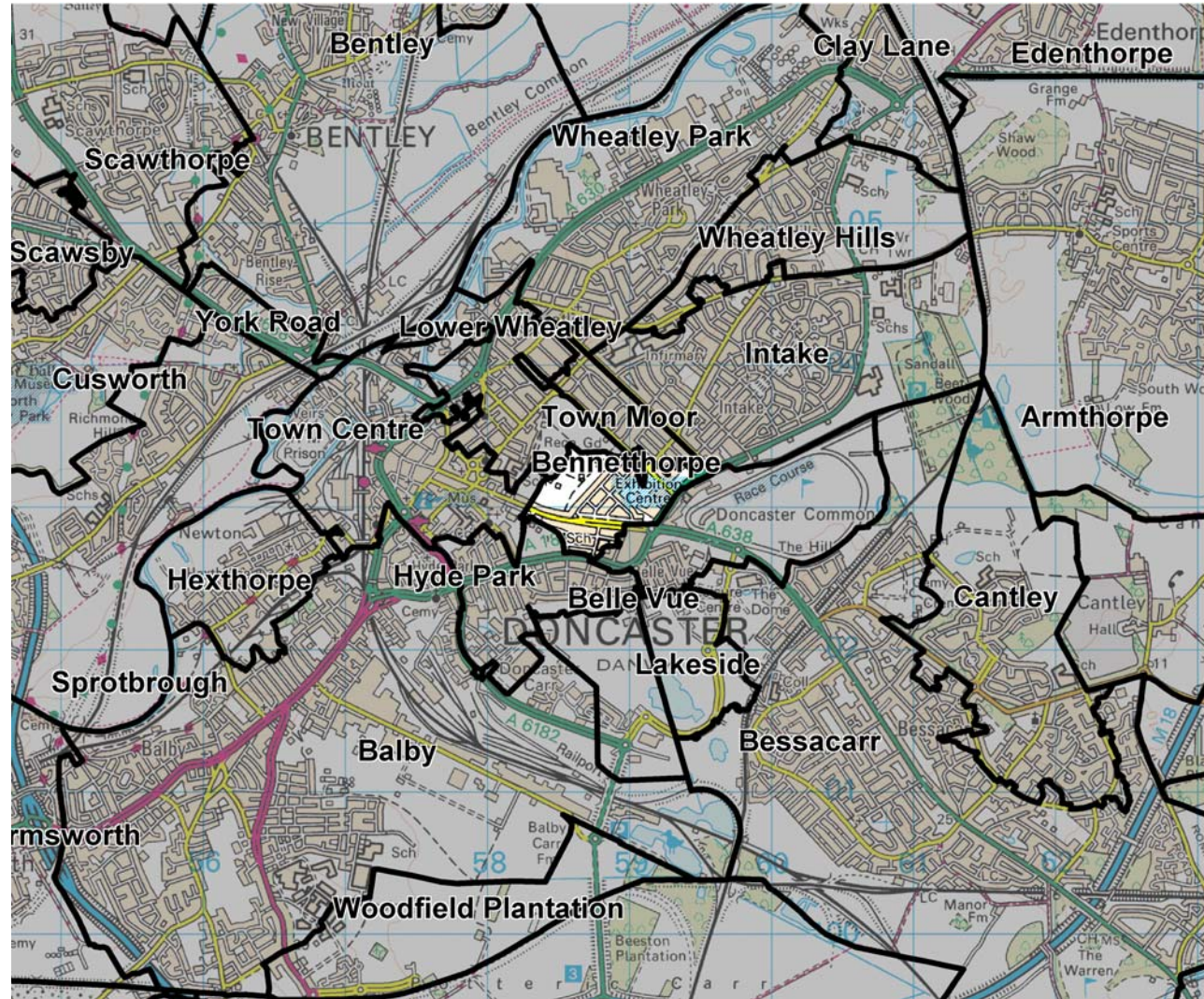

Births and Child Health

There were 37 births in Bennetthorpe between 2001 and 2003.

The general period fertility rate is 43.2 live births per 1,000 women aged 15–44, not significantly below the Doncaster average of 56.4 per 1,000.

Modelled Prevalence Data

Using national survey data, we can predict that, in Bennetthorpe:

- 278 adults (22.2% of the 16+ population) and 17 children (6.9%) are obese
- 85 adults (6.8% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
- 27 males (3.6% of the population) and 46 females (6.0%) have diabetes
