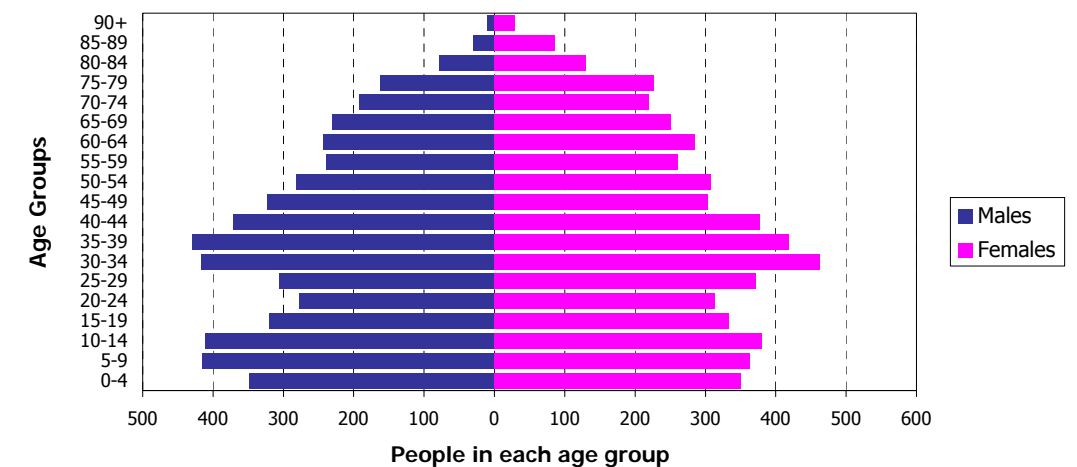

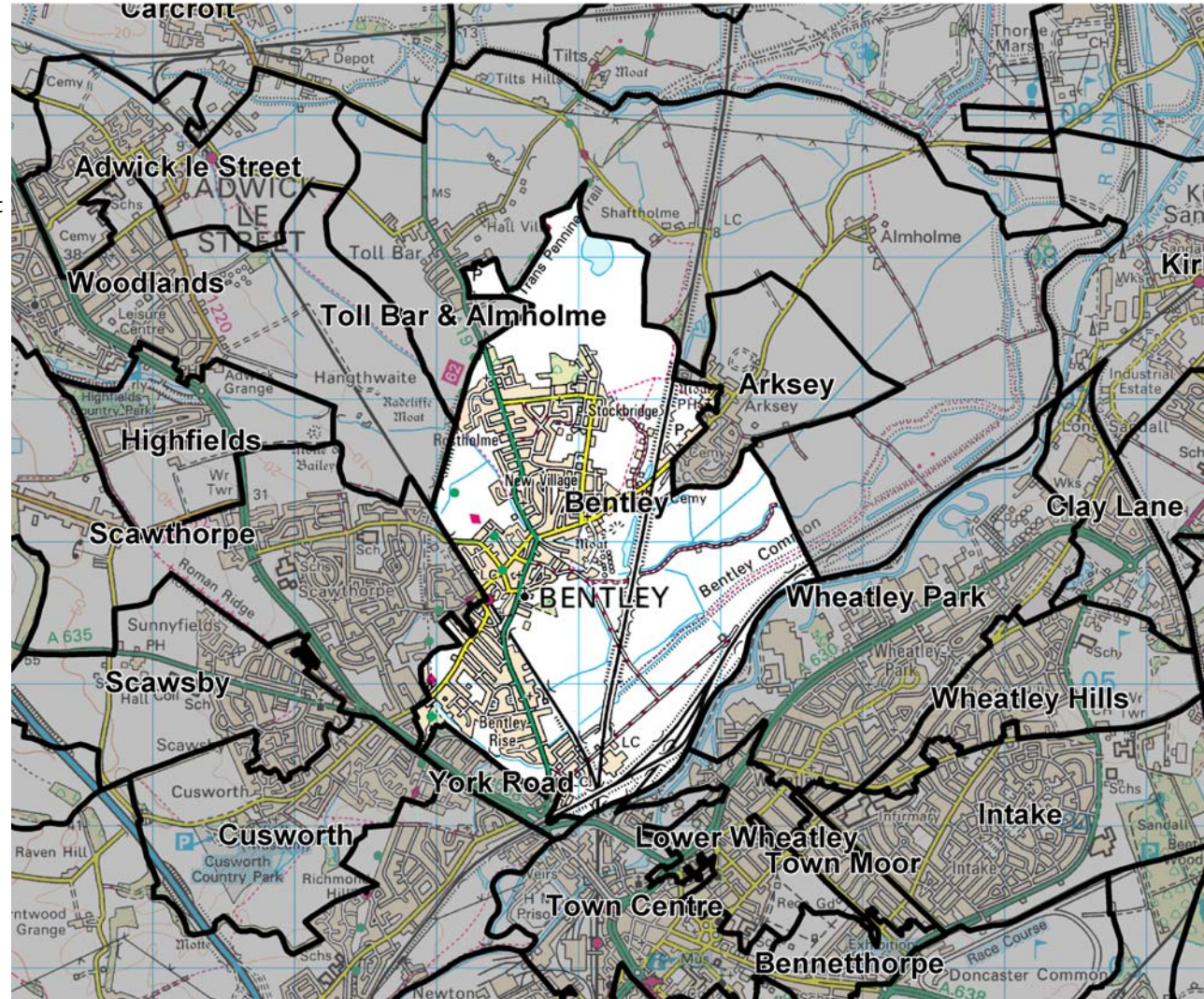

There were 389 births in Bentley between 2001 and 2003. The general period fertility rate is 56.6 live births per 1,000 women aged 15–44, not significantly above the Doncaster average of 56.4 per 1,000.

Using national survey data, we can predict that, in Bentley:

- 1,809 adults (22.3% of the 16+ population) and 148 children (6.8%) are obese
- 610 adults (7.5% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
- 166 males (3.3% of the population) and 262 females (4.8%) have diabetes
