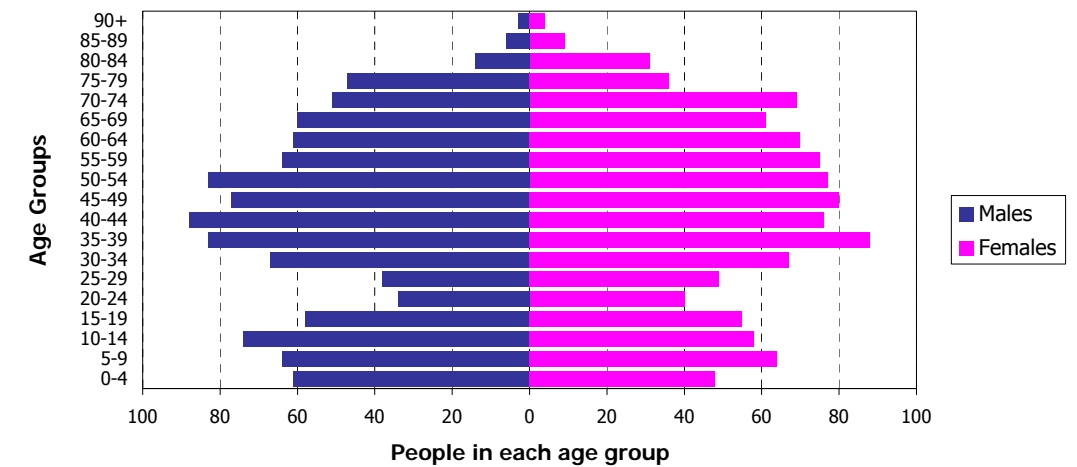

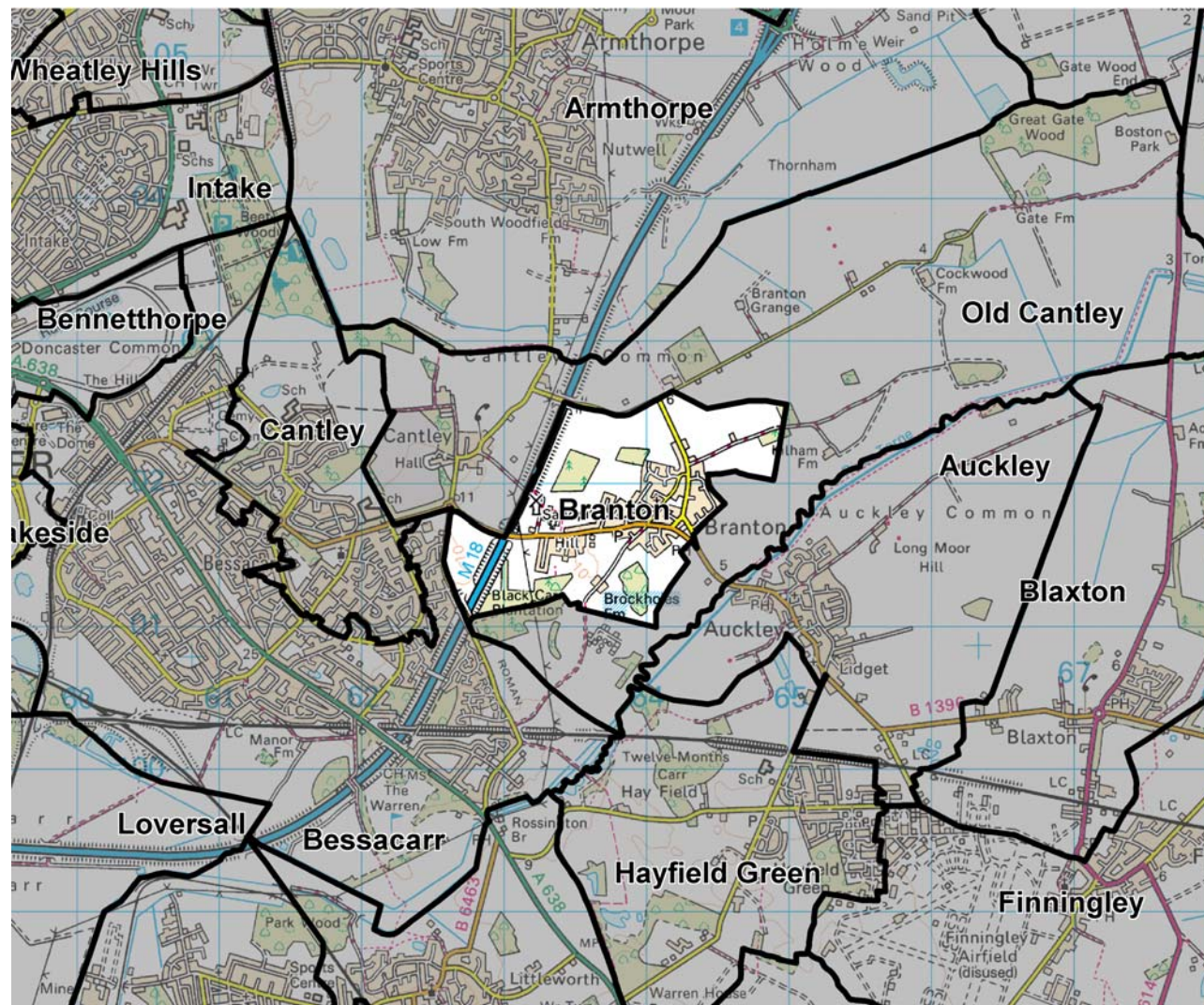

There were 54 births in Branton between 2001 and 2003. The general period fertility rate is 48.9 live births per 1,000 women aged 15-44, not significantly below the Doncaster average of 56.4 per 1,000.

Modelled Prevalence Data

Using national survey data, we can predict that, in Branton:

- 395 adults (23.6% of the 16+ population) and 26 children (6.9%) are obese
- 112 adults (6.7% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
- 42 males (4.1% of the population) and 59 females (5.6%) have diabetes
