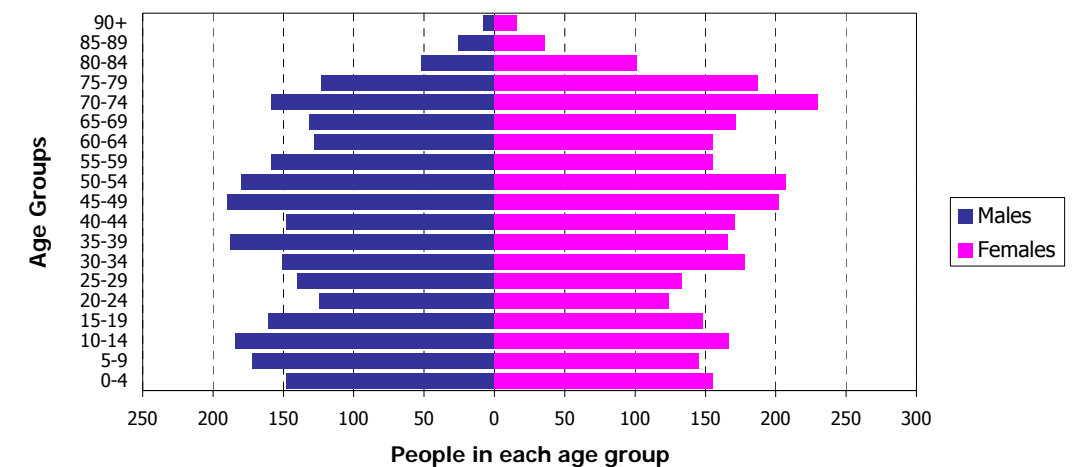

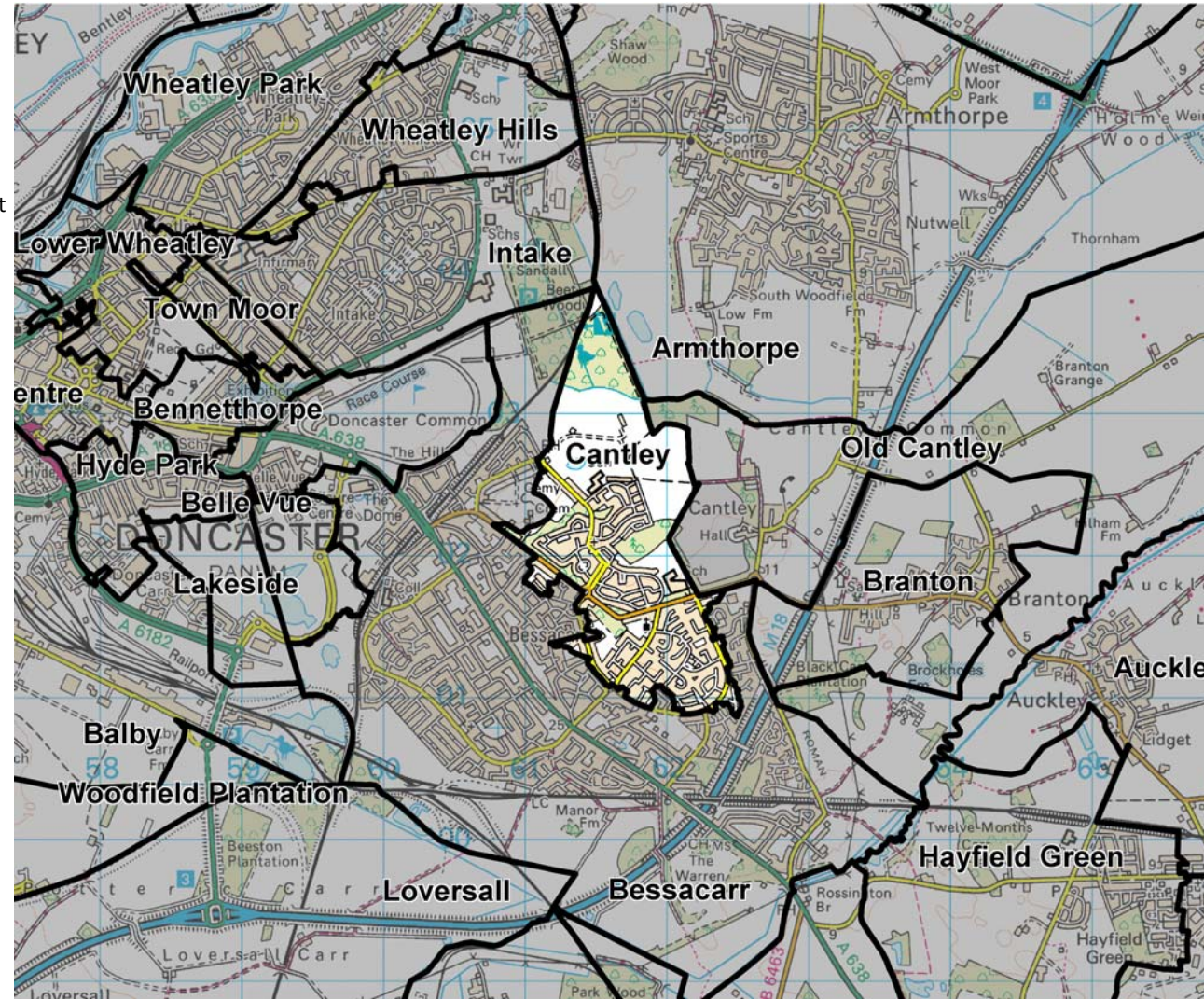

Births and Child Health

There were 155 births in Cantley between 2001 and 2003.

The general period fertility rate is 54.9 live births per 1,000 women aged 15–44, not significantly below the Doncaster average of 56.4 per 1,000.

Modelled Prevalence Data

Using national survey data, we can predict that, in Cantley:

- 1,014 adults (22.9% of the 16+ population) and 62 children (6.8%) are obese
- 413 adults (9.3% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
- 103 males (4.0% of the population) and 183 females (6.4%) have diabetes
