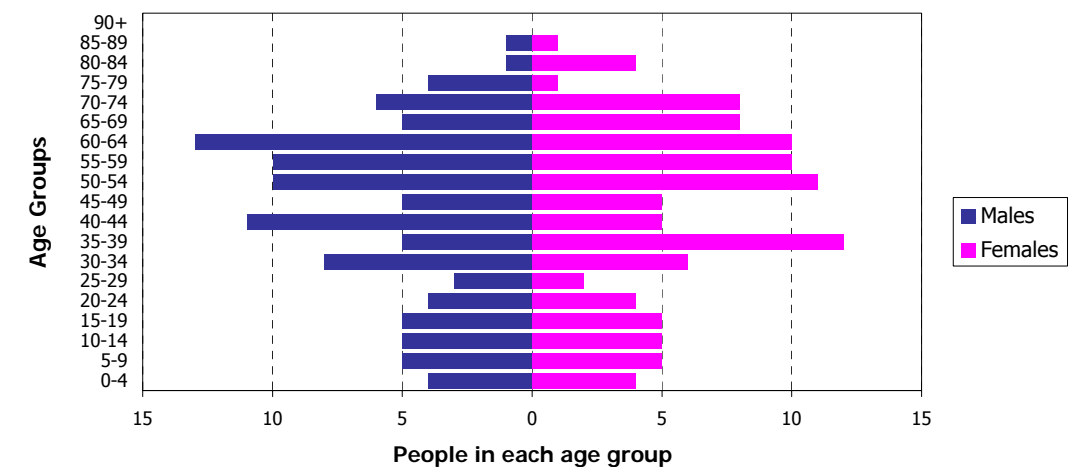

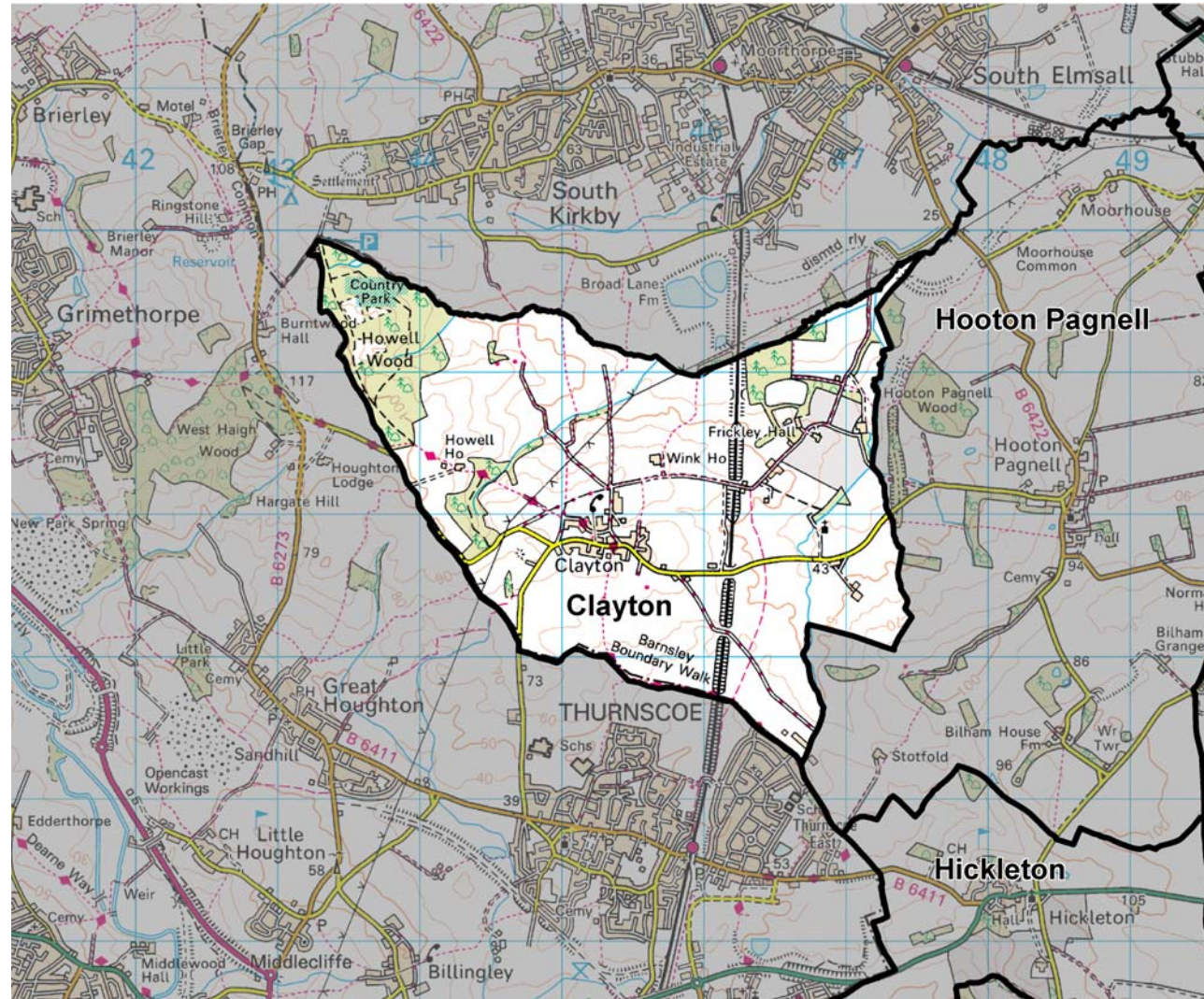

## Modelled Prevalence Data

Using national survey data, we can predict that, in Clayton:

- 44 adults (24.9% of the 16+ population) and 2 children (6.6%) are obese
- 16 adults (9.2% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
- 5 males (4.8% of the population) and 6 females (6.1%) have diabetes
