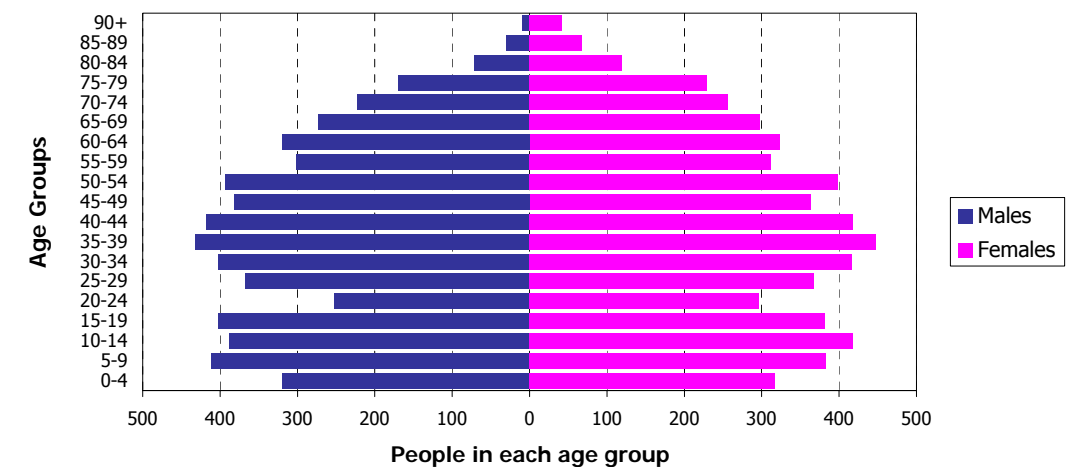

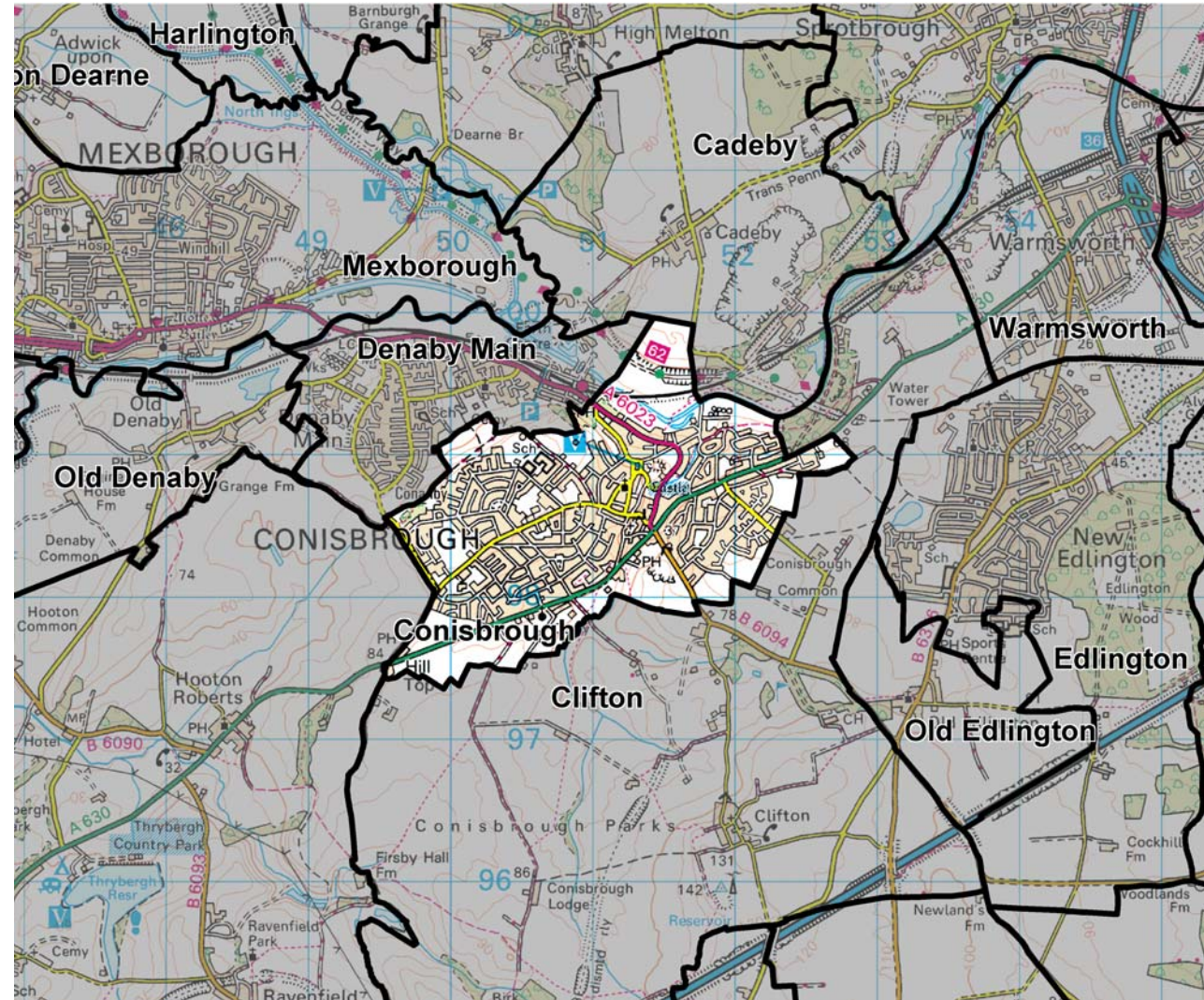

The general period fertility rate is 51.1 live births per 1,000 women aged 15–44, not significantly below the Doncaster average of 56.4 per 1,000.

Modelled Prevalence Data

Using national survey data, we can predict that, in Conisbrough:

- 2,027 adults (22.6% of the 16+ population) and 147 children (6.9%) are obese
- 631 adults (7.0% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
- 193 males (3.5% of the population) and 282 females (4.8%) have diabetes
