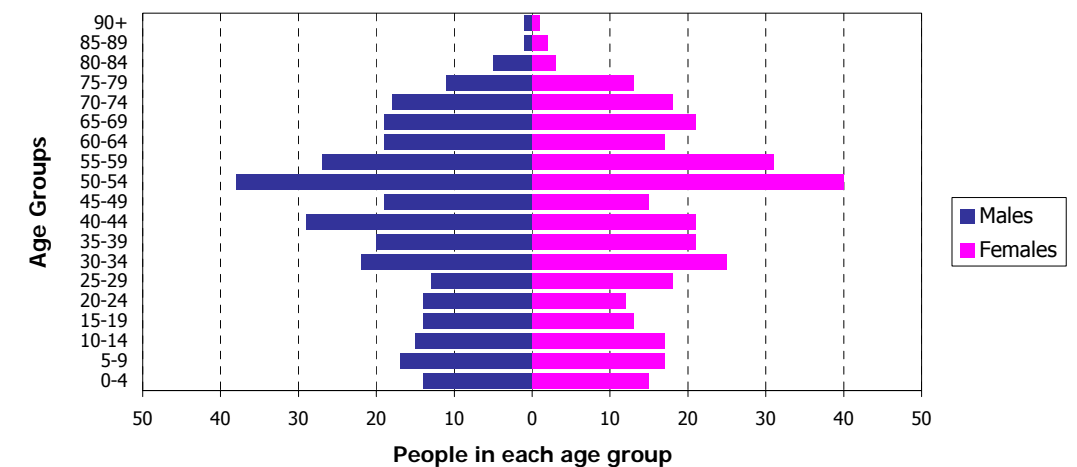

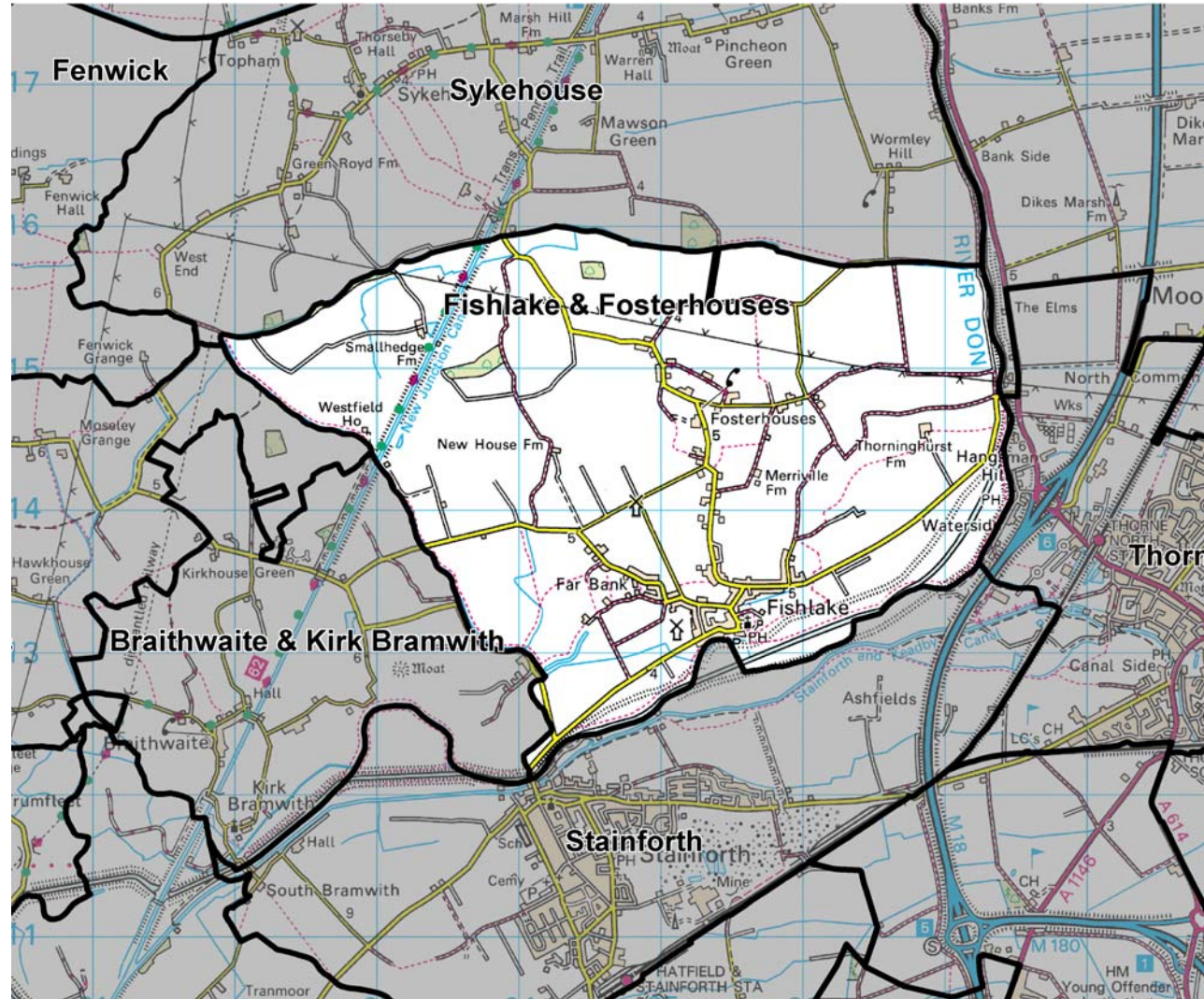

## Births and Child Health

There were 22 births in Fishlake & Fosterhouses between 2001 and 2003.

The general period fertility rate is 71.2 live births per 1,000 women aged 15–44, not significantly above the Doncaster average of 56.4 per 1,000.

## Modelled Prevalence Data

Using national survey data, we can predict that, in Fishlake & Fosterhouses:

- 126 adults (23.8% of the 16+ population) and 6 children (6.9%) are obese
- 35 adults (6.7% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
- 13 males (4.2% of the population) and 17 females (5.3%) have diabetes
