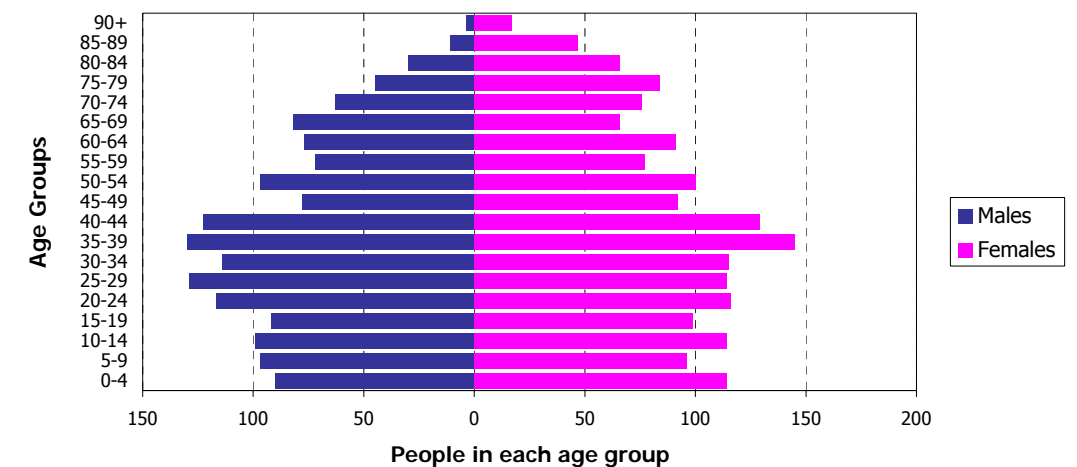

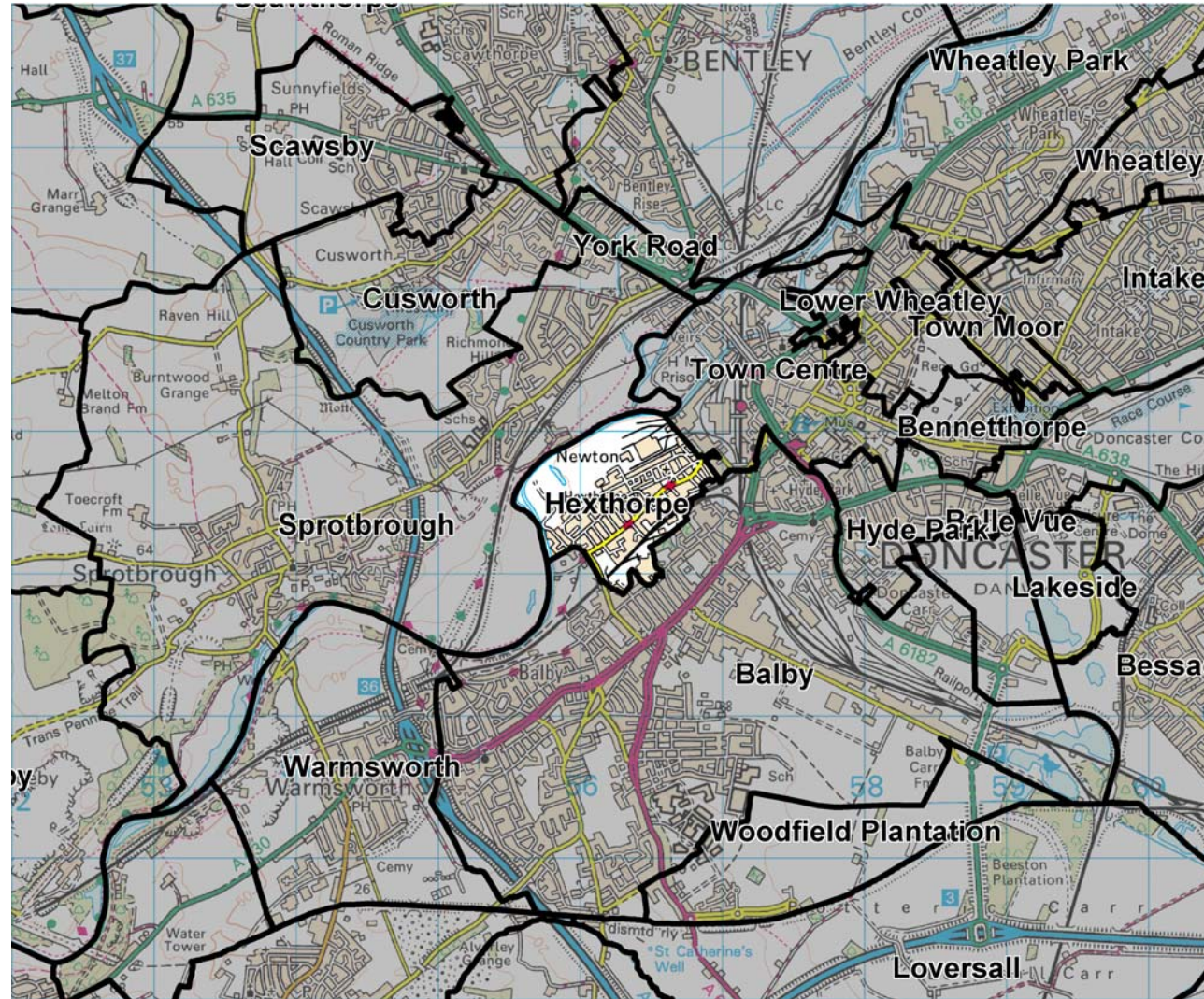

Births and Child Health

There were 125 births in Hexthorpe between 2001 and 2003. The general period fertility rate is 57.4 live births per 1,000 women aged 15–44, not significantly above the Doncaster average of 56.4 per 1,000.

Modelled Prevalence Data

Using national survey data, we can predict that, in Hexthorpe:

- 583 adults (22.1% of the 16+ population) and 42 children (6.9%) are obese
- 219 adults (8.3% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
- 56 males (3.6% of the population) and 97 females (5.5%) have diabetes
