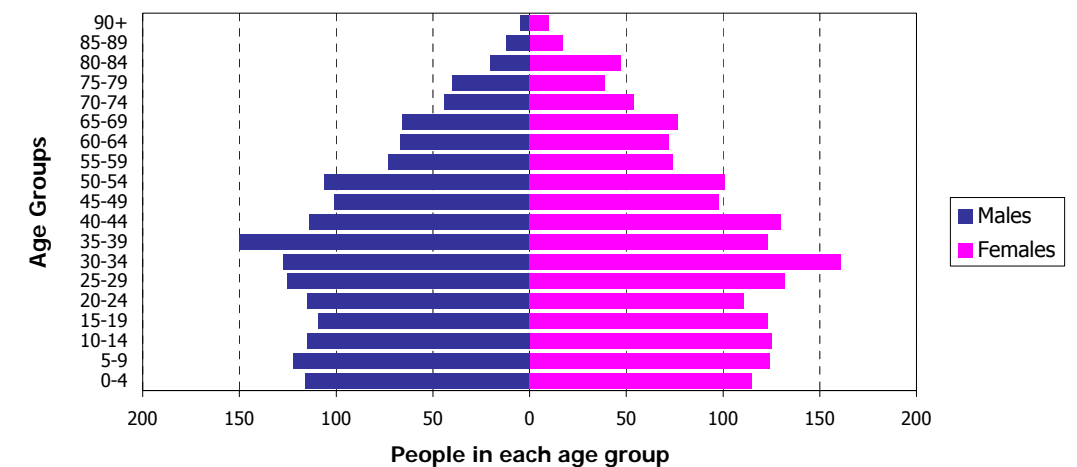

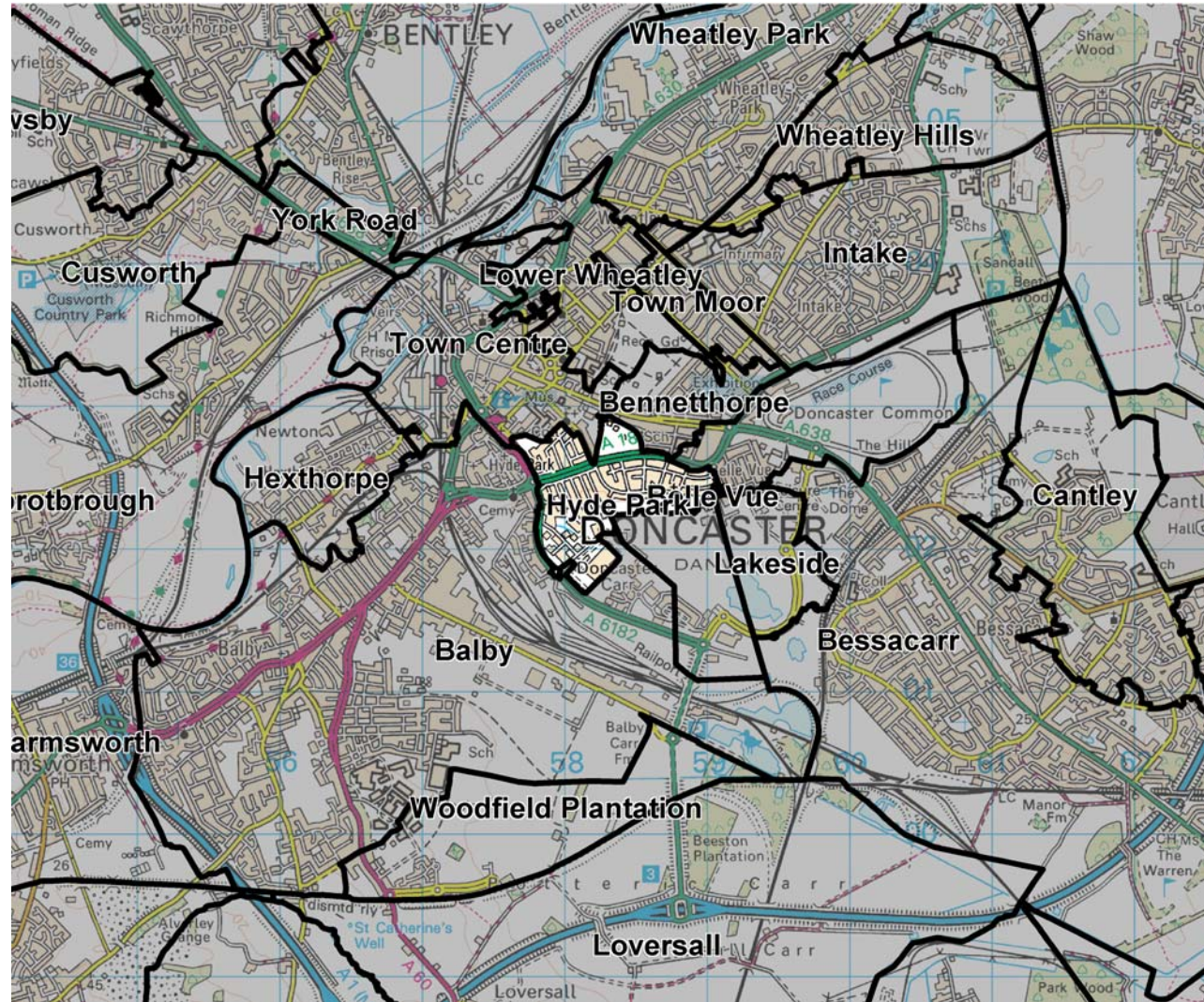

## Births and Child Health

There were 229 births in Hyde Park between 2001 and 2003.

The general period fertility rate is 95.2 live births per 1,000 women aged 15–44, very significantly above the Doncaster average of 56.4 per 1,000.

## Modelled Prevalence Data

Using national survey data, we can predict that, in Hyde Park:

- 552 adults (21.6% of the 16+ population) and 50 children (7.0%) are obese
- 172 adults (6.7% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
- 57 males (3.5% of the population) and 77 females (4.4%) have diabetes
