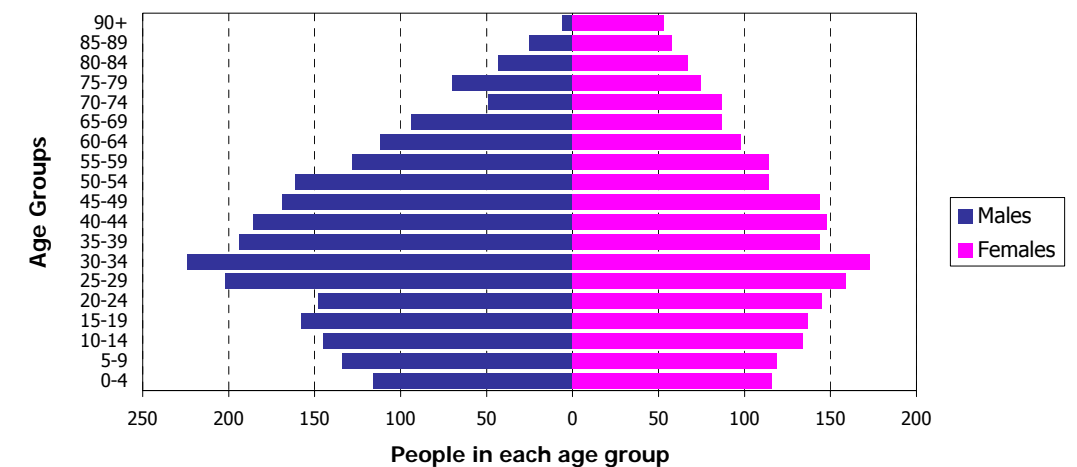

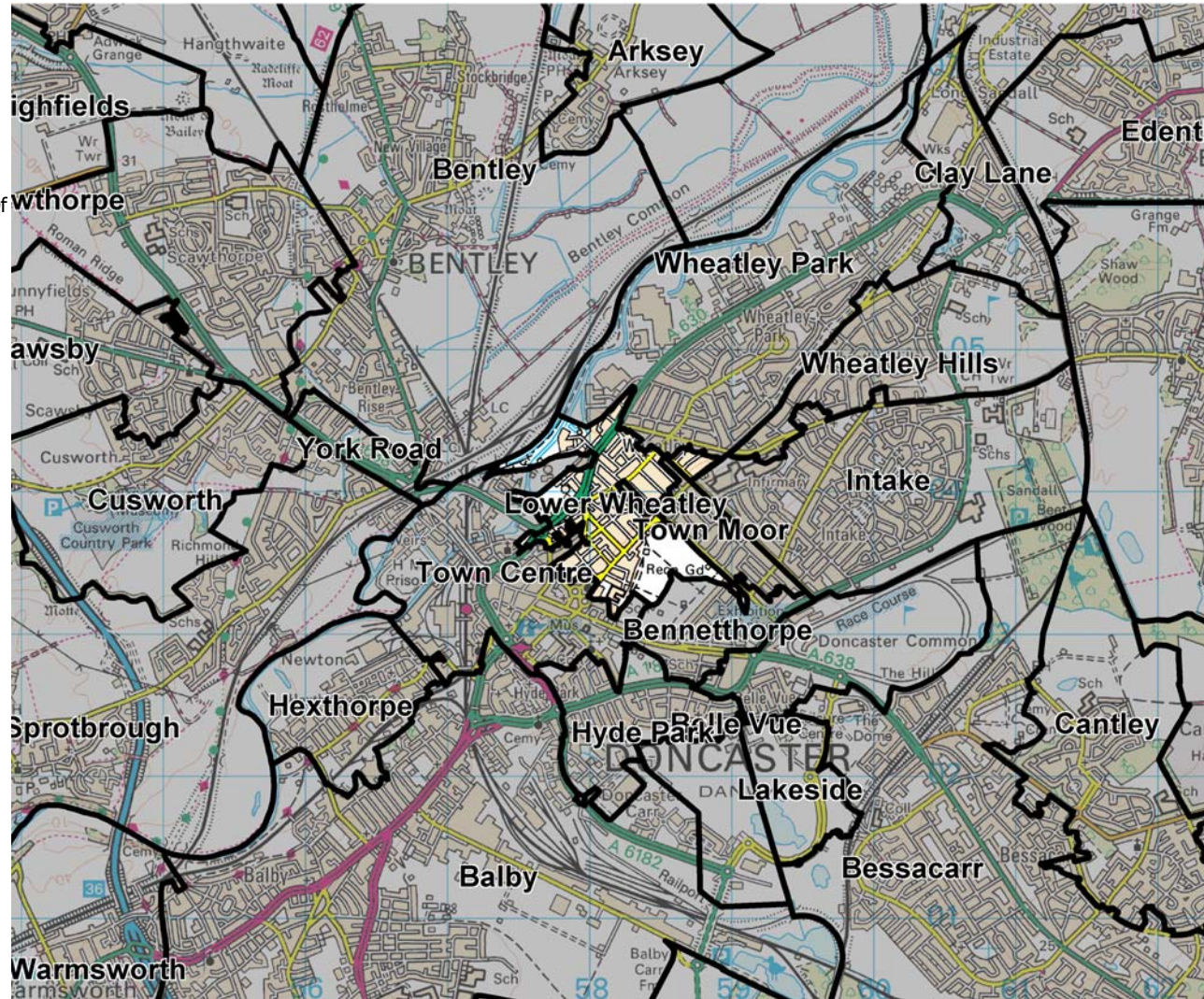

Births and Child Health

There were 208 births in Lower Wheatley between 2001 and 2003.

The general period fertility rate is 75.7 live births per 1,000 women aged 15–44, very significantly above the Doncaster average of 56.4 per 1,000.

- 830 adults (21.9% of the 16+ population) and 44 children (6.7%) are obese
- 308 adults (8.1% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
- 85 males (3.6% of the population) and 121 females (5.6%) have diabetes
