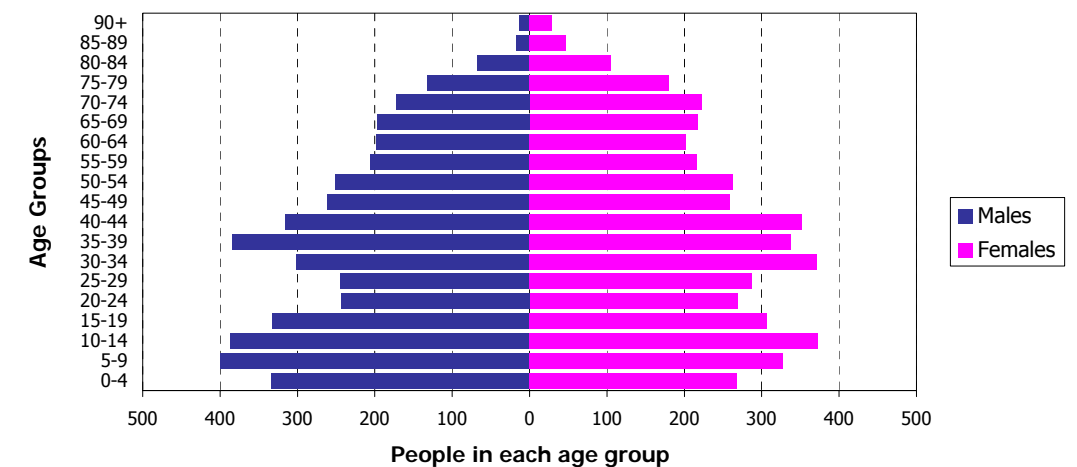

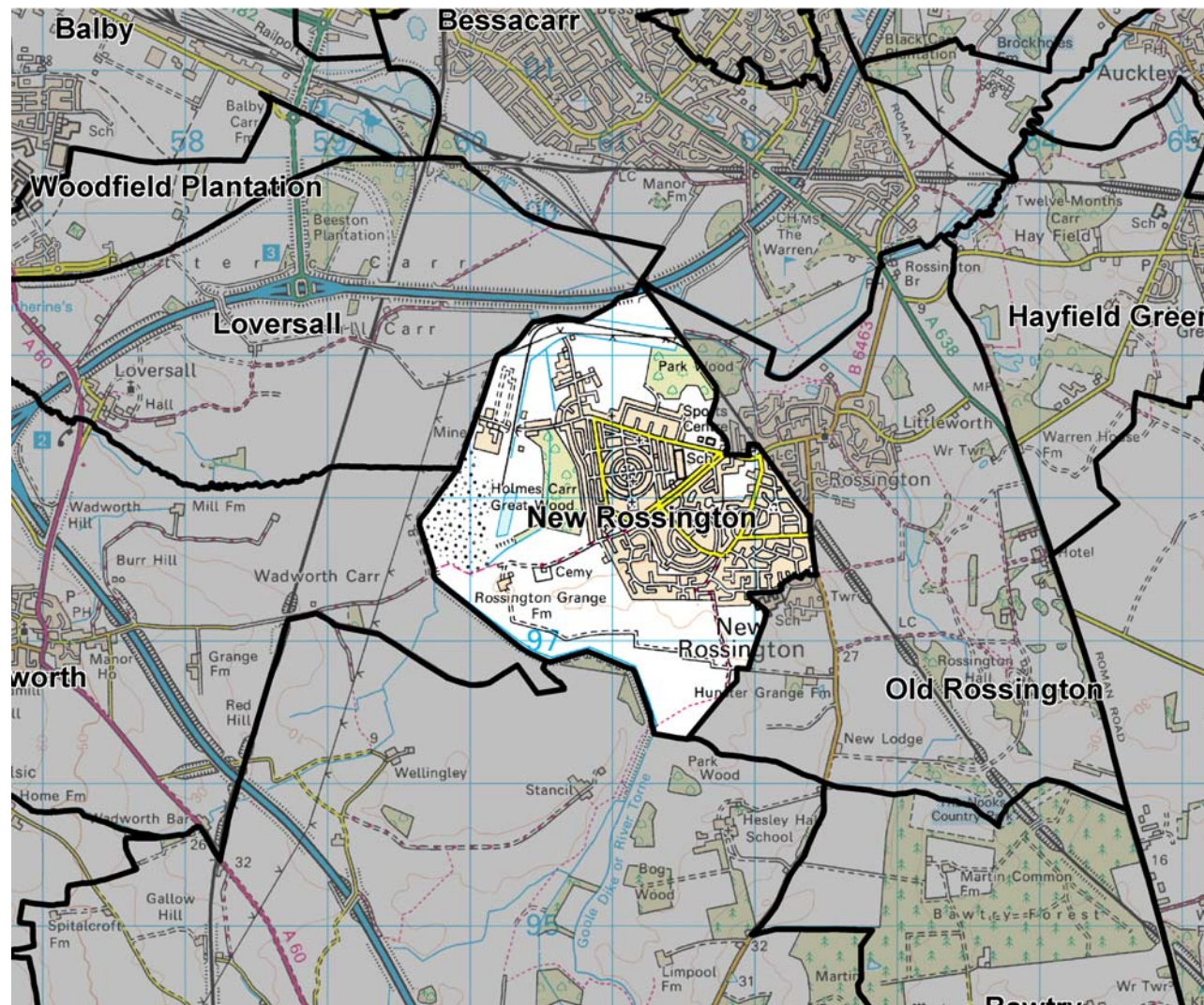

There were 364 births in New Rossington between 2001 and 2003. The general period fertility rate is 62.0 live births per 1,000 women aged 15–44, not significantly above the Doncaster average of 56.4 per 1,000.

Modelled Prevalence Data

Using national survey data, we can predict that, in New Rossington:

- 1,515 adults (22.2% of the 16+ population) and 141 children (6.8%) are obese
- 505 adults (7.4% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
- 138 males (3.1% of the population) and 214 females (4.6%) have diabetes
