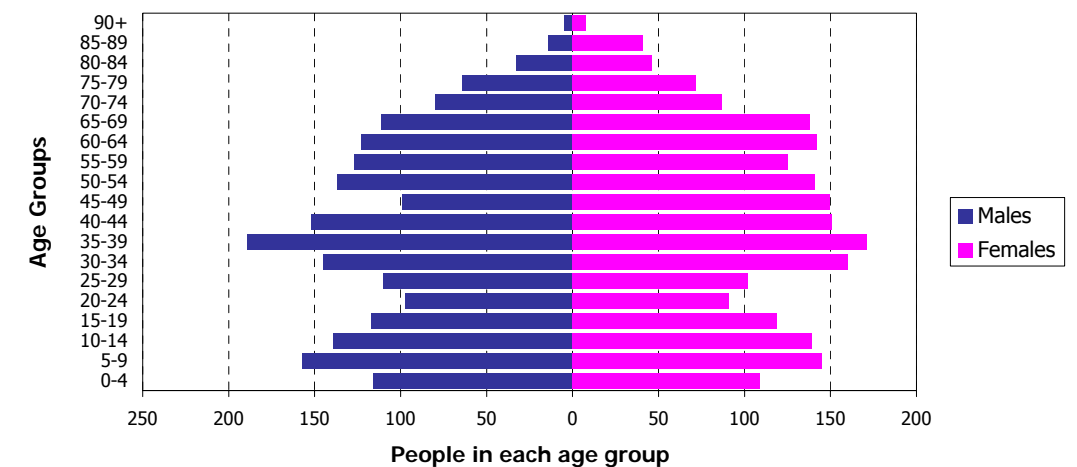

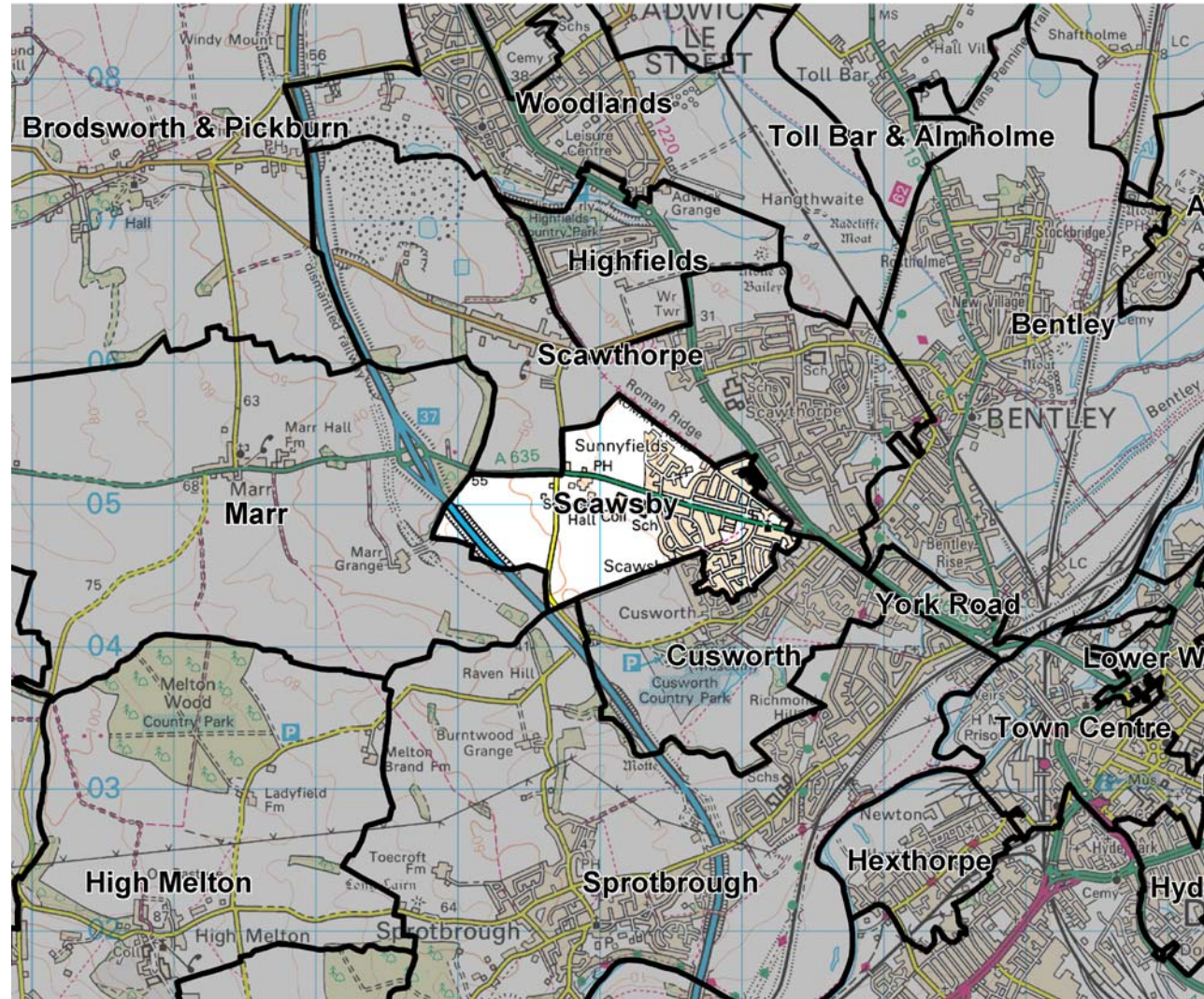

- 755 adults (22.9% of the 16+ population) and 53 children (6.9%) are obese
- 240 adults (7.3% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
- 73 males (3.6% of the population) and 108 females (5.1%) have diabetes
