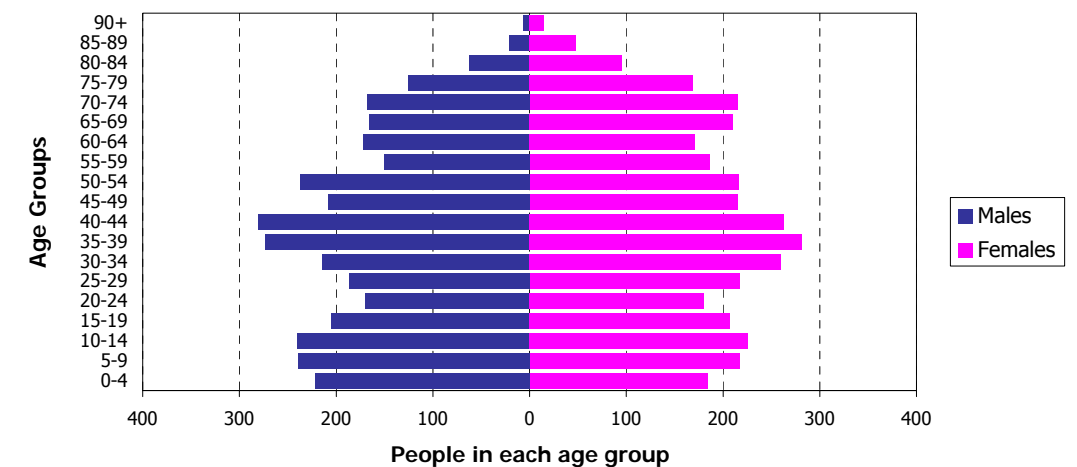

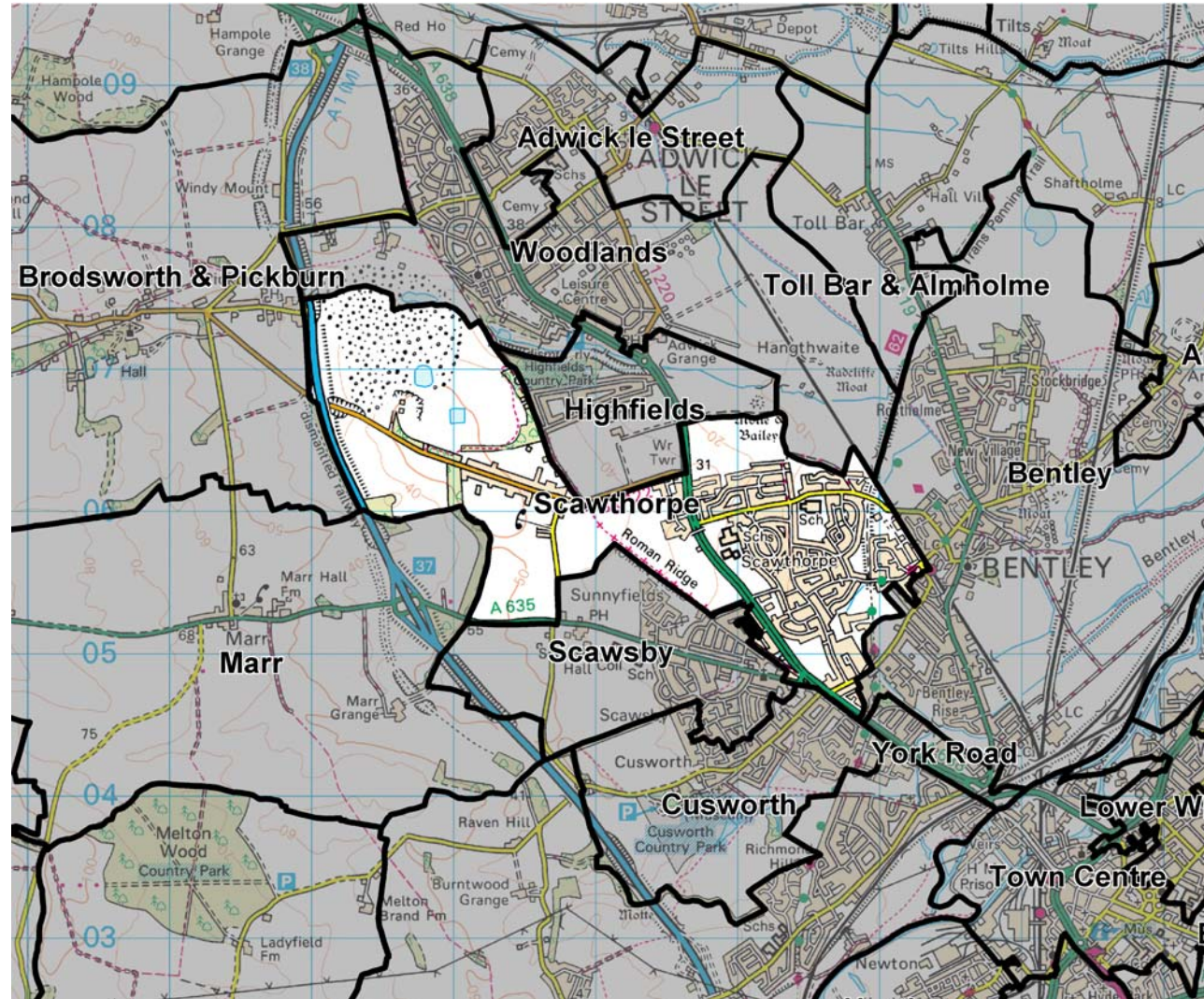

Births and Child Health

There were 185 births in Scawthorpe between 2001 and 2003.

The general period fertility rate is 44.4 live births per 1,000 women aged 15–44, very significantly below the Doncaster average of 56.4 per 1,000.

Modelled Prevalence Data

Using national survey data, we can predict that, in Scawthorpe:

- 1,253 adults (22.8% of the 16+ population) and 86 children (6.8%) are obese
- 424 adults (7.7% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
- 122 males (3.7% of the population) and 192 females (5.4%) have diabetes
