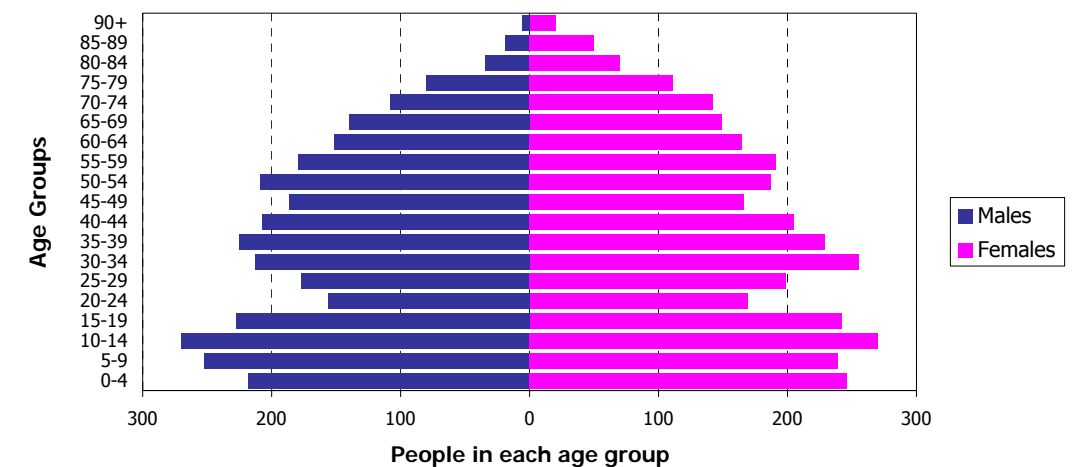

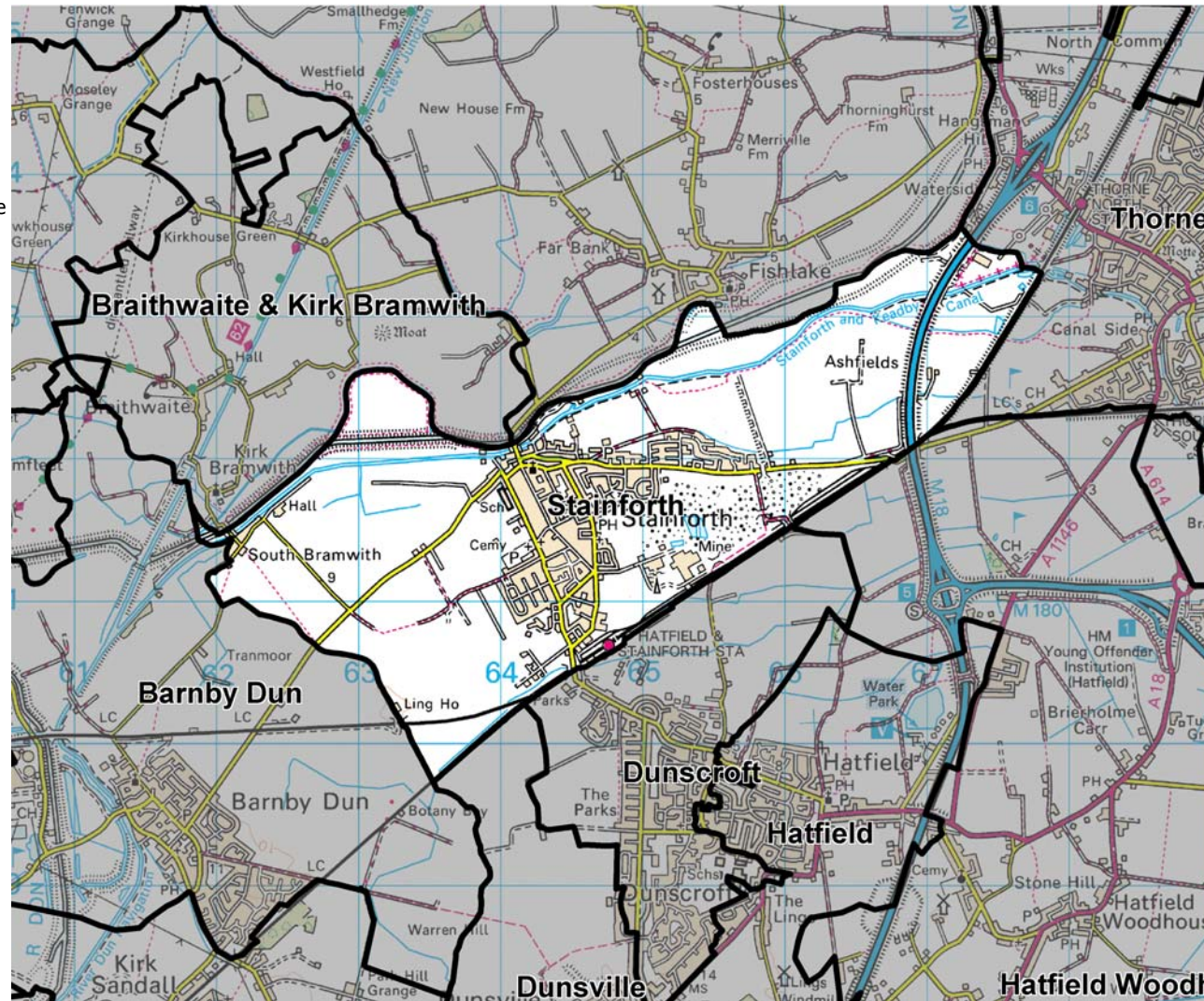

## Births and Child Health

There were 280 births in Stainforth between 2001 and 2003.

The general period fertility rate is 70.6 live births per 1,000 women aged 15–44, very significantly above the Doncaster average of 56.4 per 1,000.

## Modelled Prevalence Data

Using national survey data, we can predict that, in Stainforth:

- 1,070 adults (22.4% of the 16+ population) and 99 children (6.8%) are obese
- 388 adults (8.1% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
- 98 males (3.2% of the population) and 150 females (4.5%) have diabetes
