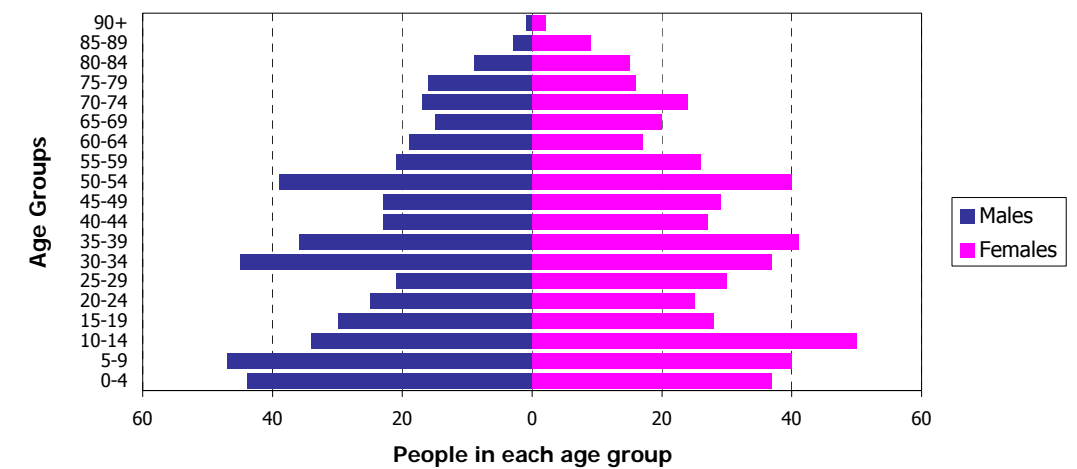

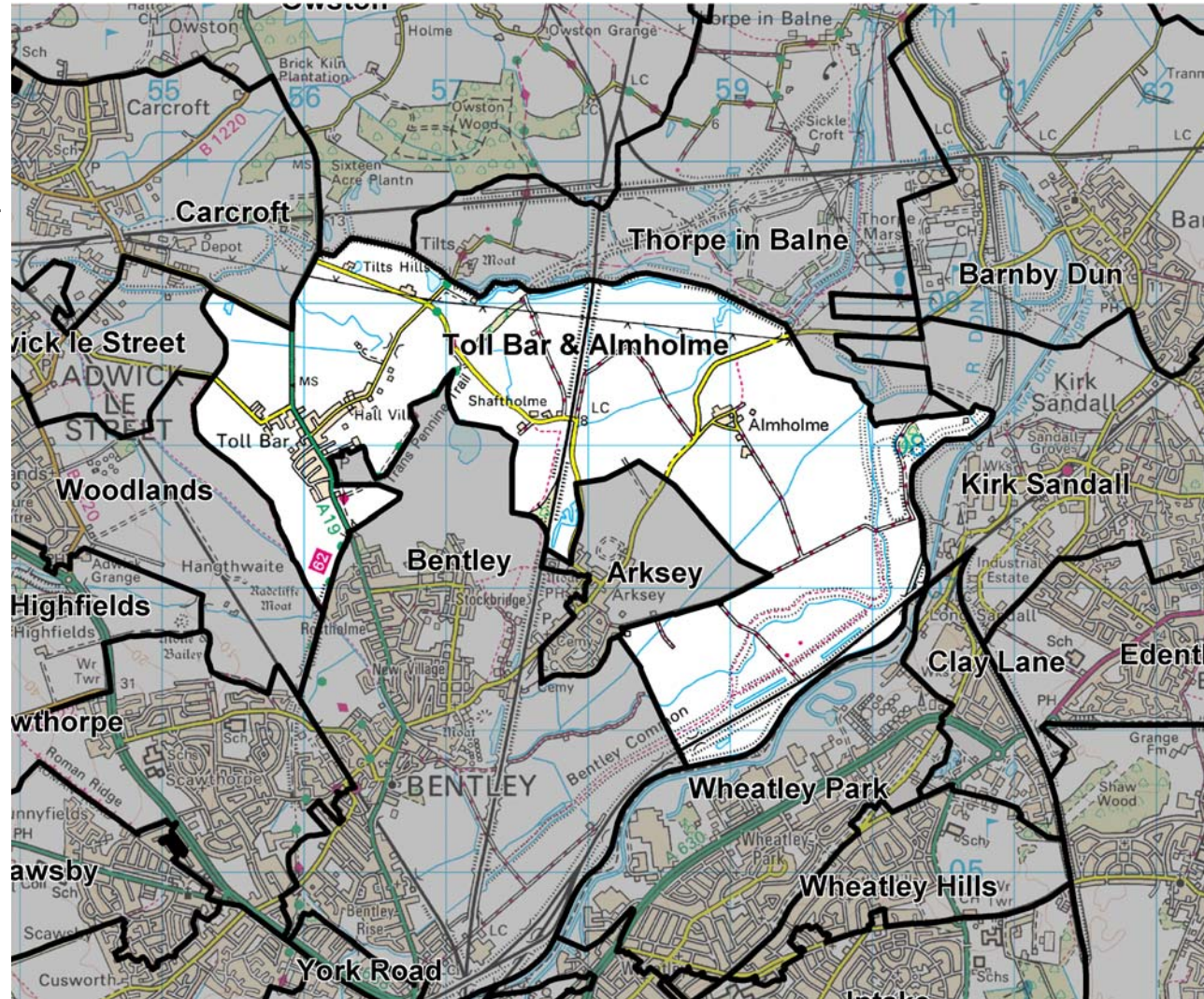

There were 44 births in Toll Bar & Almholme between 2001 and 2003. The general period fertility rate is 75.2 live births per 1,000 women aged 15–44, not significantly above the Doncaster average of 56.4 per 1,000.

Modelled Prevalence Data

Using national survey data, we can predict that, in Toll Bar & Almholme:

- 159 adults (22.2% of the 16+ population) and 16 children (6.8%) are obese
- 59 adults (8.2% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
- 14 males (3.0% of the population) and 24 females (4.6%) have diabetes
