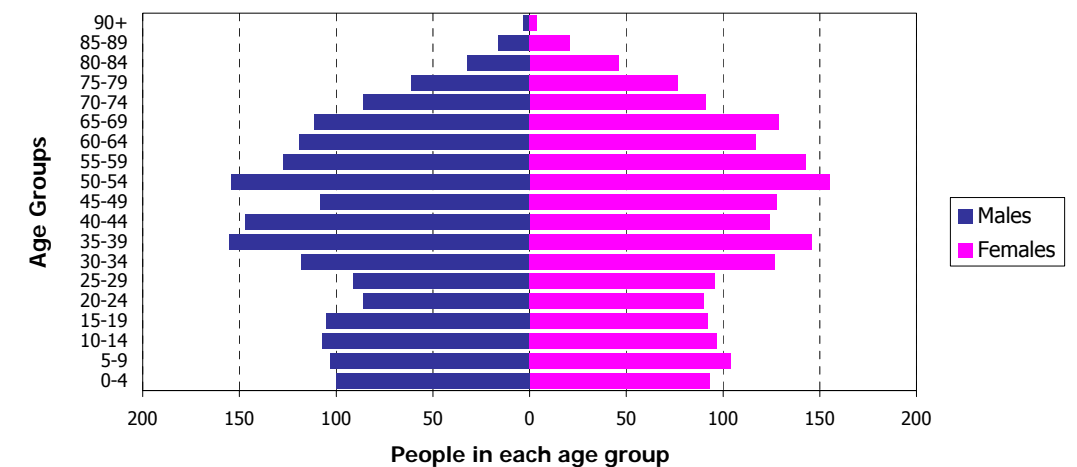

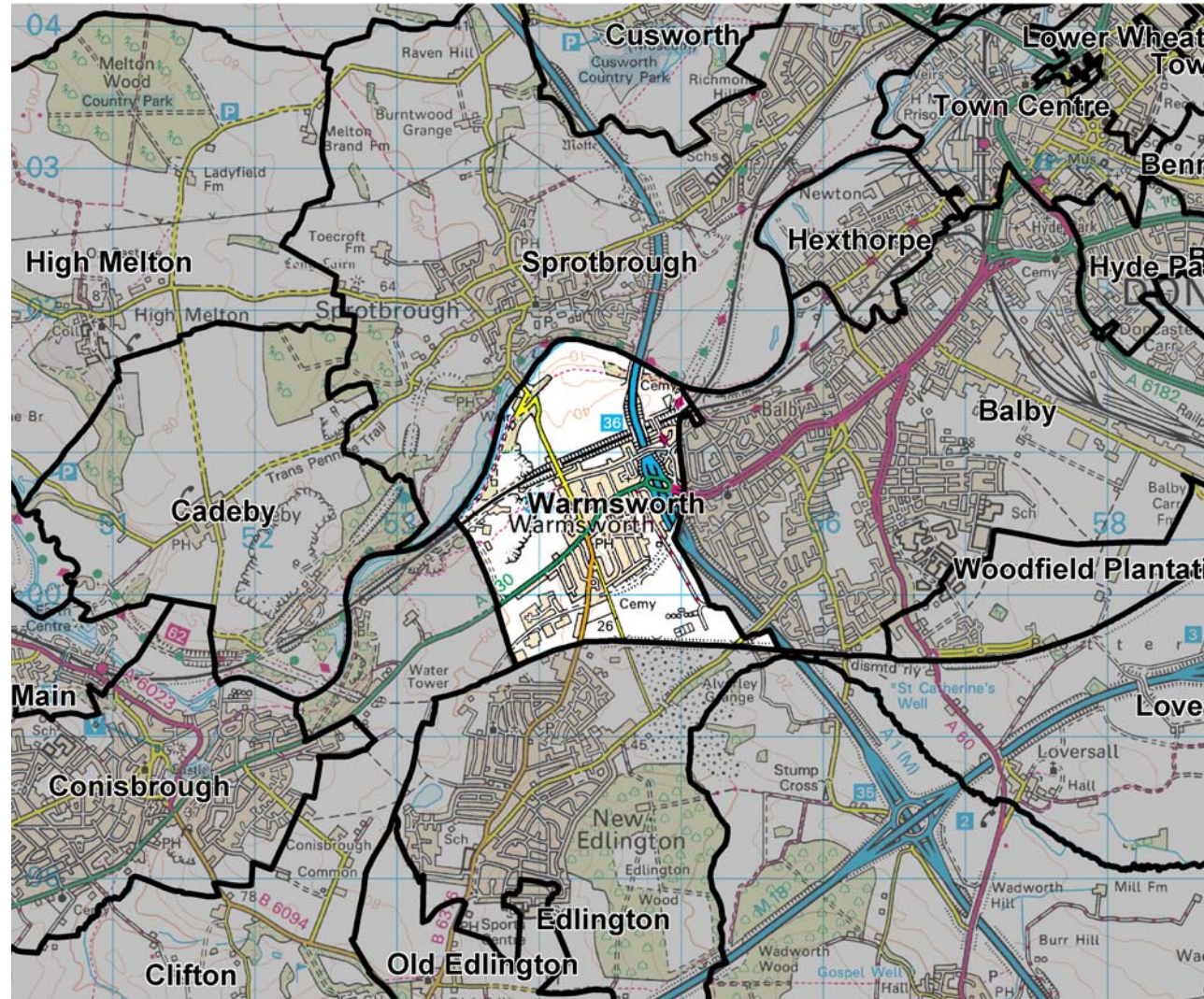

The general period fertility rate is 51.7 live births per 1,000 women aged 15–44, not significantly below the Doncaster average of 56.4 per 1,000.

- 712 adults (23.2% of the 16+ population) and 39 children (6.8%) are obese
- 220 adults (7.2% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
- 73 males (4.0% of the population) and 102 females (5.4%) have diabetes
