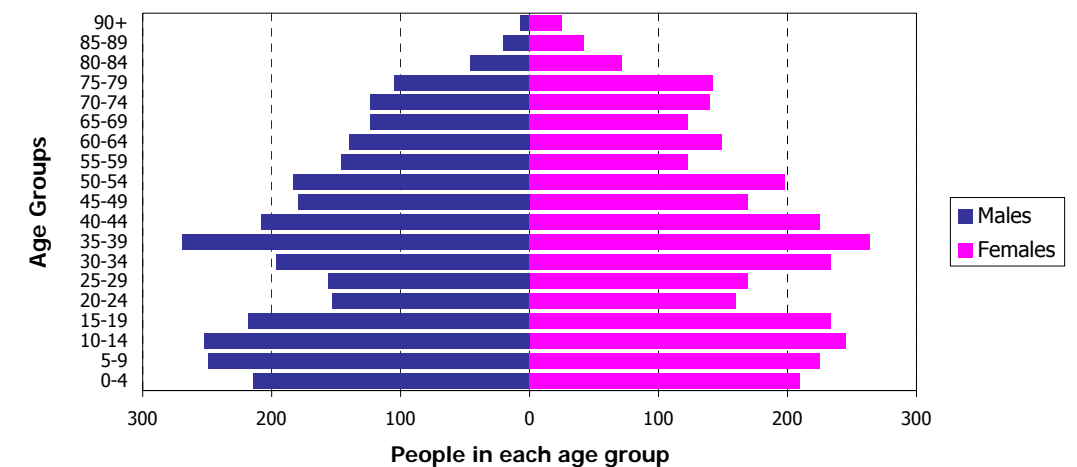

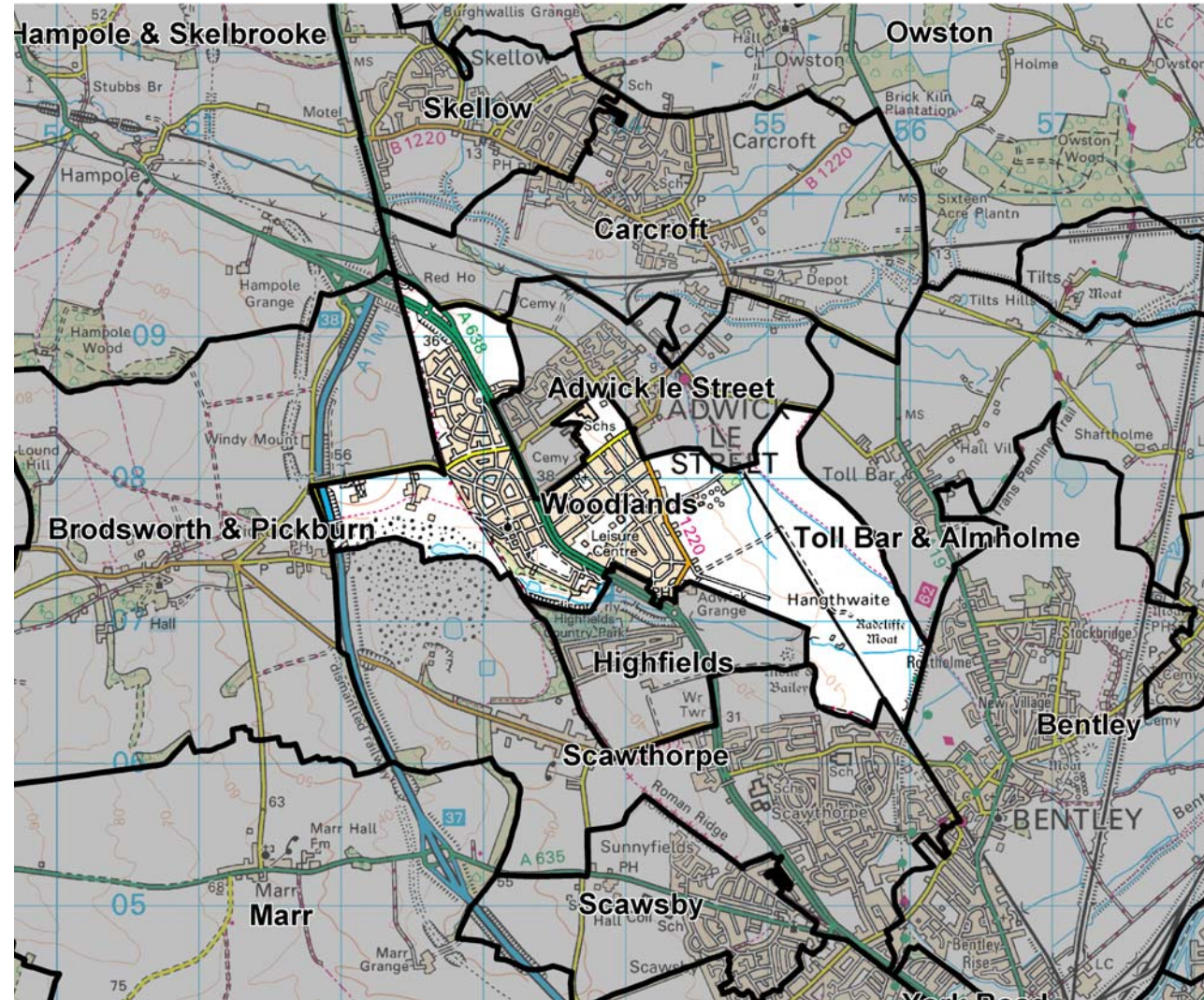

There were 270 births in Woodlands between 2001 and 2003.

The general period fertility rate is 69.9 live births per 1,000 women aged 15–44, very significantly above the Doncaster average of 56.4 per 1,000.

## Modelled Prevalence Data

Using national survey data, we can predict that, in Woodlands:

- 1,025 adults (22.3% of the 16+ population) and 94 children (6.8%) are obese
- 357 adults (7.8% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
- 98 males (3.3% of the population) and 149 females (4.7%) have diabetes
